## MICRO WEDDING

# 1

Small wedding ceremony. Guests to be physically distanced and everyone required to wear a mask. This event can be live-streamed for those who can't be in attendance.

## MINI WEDDING

# 2

Small wedding ceremony, formal pictures, followed by a mini reception that includes: formal introduction; first dance; cake cutting; and grand exit

## MINI WEDDING PLUS

# 3

Small wedding ceremony, formal pictures, followed by a mini reception that includes: formal introduction; first dance; cake cutting; outdoor lawn games; and grand exit

## MULTI-CELEBRATION

# 4

Micro or Mini ceremony now and then a full reception on the couple's one-year anniversary. If scheduled on their actual anniversary date, this will help planners, venues, and vendors because it will stagger dates onto less popular wedding days like weekdays. This allows the wedding industry to keep their Saturdays available for new clients in 2021.
